### **Scenic Tram Ride**

A ride on the Scenic Aerial Tram is a spectacular and leisurely ride 2,000 vertical feet to High Camp, el. 8200'. The Aerial Tram is one of Squaw Valley's most popular year-round attractions. Once you reach the top, enjoy panoramic views of Lake Tahoe plus access to activities and dining options.

Tram Tickets can be purchased at the main ticket office.

### **High Camp Hot Tub**

Squaw Valley's Swimming Pool & Hot Tub is one of the most breathtaking places in the world to relax. Located at High Camp, el.8,200', the Swimming Pool & Hot Tub is surrounded by the beauty of the Sierra including views of Lake Tahoe. (Hot Tub is open late March thru April. Pool and Hot Tub open mid-June thru Labor Day - weather permitting)

\$10 admission includes towel and a locker



### **Umbrella Bar**

The Umbrella Bar is the place to be during the spring at Squaw Valley! Here you can grab a drink and hang out by the water's edge while you soak up the California sunshine. Whether you are looking for a place to relax poolside, take a soak in the enormous jacuzzi and enjoy the beautiful views at el 8,200, or hang out with the family, this is surely the place to be.



### **Poolside Café**

Offering delicious lunch options with seating either inside or outside on the beautiful sun deck, overlooking the Pool and Hot Tub. The poolside menu includes soup and salad bar, hot sandwiches, burgers, wraps, and more.



### **Olympic Museum**

Take a trip back in time and learn about the 1960 Winter Olympics that took place at Squaw Valley. The recently renovated Olympic Museum, located at High Camp showcases our unique collection of memorabilia, news articles, and video presentations detailing the many magical moments that took place at Squaw Valley.
